VFC SPA is committed to promoting a culture of sustainability, controlling operations while minimizing our environmental and social impacts, allowing for economic benefits like the integration of sustainable principles and practices in all of our production processes, while including our workers, suppliers, clients, and communities, always meeting current national legislation.

In order to meet these principles and goals, VFC SPA commits to:

- **1.** Conserve and regenerate the existing natural vegetation in our vineyards, in the common areas of our installations and their surroundings.
- 2. Not contribute to the contamination of underground or groundwater, and to treat all of our wastewater.
- **3.** Ensure fair labor practices, a safe and healthy work environment, and promote the personal development of our personnel.
- **4.** Interact with the local communities and contribute to improving the quality of life and local development.
- **5.** Apply an Integrated Pest Management system in our vineyards, taking into consideration all of the security measures necessary for our workers, the community, and the environment.
- **6.** Value the soils of our vineyards as a fundamental resource, and as such protect them and maintain their viability for agricultural purposes in the long term.
- 7. Promote the recycling, reusing, and safe disposal of our organic and inorganic residues.
- **8.** Promote the implementation of plans for the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions and reduction of our carbon footprint.
- **9.** Use water sustainably while implementing plans to reduce our use during the production process.
- **10.** Promote the reduction of our energy consumption, incorporating renewable energy sources.
- **11.** Meet all requirements in the winery's Sustainability Code, systematically improving our performance and ensuring the continual improvement in our processes.

The Sustainability Policy for VFC SPA is to be applied to all related entities, as well as to all business units and operations in general. Meeting these standards is the responsibility of all of the company's workers.
